Contemporary Fiction & Romance:

GOTHICTOWN by Emily Carpenter – April 2025

Kensington debut inspired by Shirley Jackson's *The Lottery* and for fans of Camilla Sten's *The Lost Village* that is a blend of suspense and horror following a woman who moves her family from their cramped New York City apartment to a seemingly idyllic town, only to discover the darkness that lurks beneath the surface of the friendly, if forced, smiles and the sun-dappled streets: the email that lands in Billie's inbox seems like a gift from the universe. For \$100, she can purchase a spacious home in Juliana, a small town eager to boost its economy in the wake of the pandemic. She can leave behind her overstuffed New York City rental and the painful memories of shuttering her once thriving restaurant and start over with her husband and daughter. Plus, she'll get a business grant to open a new restaurant in a charming riverside community laden with opportunity.

A few phone calls and one hurried visit later, and Billie, Peter, and 6-year-old Meredith are officially part of the Juliana Initiative. The town is everything promised—a world away from city living with weather as warm as its people. Between settling into their lavish home and starting her new restaurant, Billie is busy enough to dismiss niggling concerns.

Yet those misgivings grow. Billie's sleep is marred by haunting dreams, and her marriage with Peter is growing increasingly strained. Meanwhile the town elders, all descended from Juliana's founding families, exert a level of influence that feels less benevolent and more stifling day by day. There's something about Juliana—something off-kilter and menacing beneath that hospitality. And no matter how much Billie longed for her family to come here, she's starting to wonder how, and if, they'll ever leave. Would appeal to readers of Stacy Willingham, Julia Bartz, and Kiersten White.

THE BIG FIX by Holly James - April 2025

Genre-blending novel with a strong voice that is part romcom, part comedic suspense, and is ideal for fans of *Raiders of the Lost Heart* by Jo Segura, the *Finlay Donovan* series by Elle Cosimano, and *The Bodyguard* by Katherine Center. A modern mashup of screwball action and romantic attraction when a case of mistaken identity lands a college professor on the run with a mysterious—and dangerously hot— fixer.

When bookish Penny reluctantly lets her sister drag her to an estate sale at a neighbor's house, she's hoping for a little diversion rummaging through dusty antiques. Instead, she ends up in a public squabble over candlesticks with the deceased owner's (very hot) nephew, Anthony—right before a dead body tumbles out of a closet.

Penny's plan for the summer involved finalizing tenure at the university where she's a computer sciences professor. Instead, she's suddenly on the run with a man she barely knows, scaling walls, evading bullets, and accidentally stabbing henchmen. It seems the wrong people have got it in their heads that she's Anthony's girlfriend, in possession of something they desperately need—and will do anything to get.

As for Anthony, he has a top-secret occupation as a fixer—in addition to a set of impossibly ripped abs. But a recent fix went dangerously awry, and now he and Penny are dodging both a ruthless billionaire and the FBI. And it'll take all of Penny's plentiful common sense, in addition to Anthony's skills, to survive long enough for her to see the next semester.

Intense dark mafia romance series featuring elite criminal families, morally gray anti-heroes, and breath-stealing tension for fans of J.T. A young woman who's spent years traveling the globe to outrun her own grief faces a momentous decision on her 33rd birthday: all Stevie wanted was a cozy life in suburbia—a loving husband, adorable kids, a dog. That simple dream shattered when she was only 16 and she has spent the years since trying to outrun the pain and make something of herself, if only to prove to her estranged family that she's happy and successful.

So Stevie "dates" new countries, from Paris to Cairo to Cabo San Lucas, curating a gorgeous Instagram feed. Then one frigid January day in Rome she meets Paulo. He would be her perfect match—if they weren't separated by continents and obligations. Unable to say goodbye, they agree that if they're both single at 33, they'll marry each other. And then January of their 33rd rolls around and suddenly it's up to Stevie to choose happiness.

SUMMER IN A BOTTLE by Annie Rains – May 2025

Feel-good fiction from *USA Today*-bestseller Rains ideal for readers of Rebecca Searle: dumped by her fiancé, opinion columnist Lyla returns home to heal, and to help her parents prep their house for sale. When she decides to open a time capsule she buried when she was 18-years-old, she finds a diary filled with moments from the last summer she spent at home. Some of the events feel like they happened yesterday. That's normal. Not so normal is that they start happening all over again. As her current summer increasingly mirrors that last one, Lyla worries it will end just as disastrously. And when she reconnects with Travis, Lyla becomes certain that unless she does what her younger self was unable to do, she'll suffer the same regrets. But if this time around she can gather her courage, maybe the life that was falling apart when she arrived will fall back together—even better than before.

CHASING THE RING by Lauren Rowe – February 2026

Kensington debut from self-published author Rowe, who is a *USA Today* and Amazon bestselling author with a highly-engaged social media fanbase: hours before her wedding day, Iris finds out her fiancé has been cheating on her. A lot. She devises a plan for revenge with the help of her best friends and ultimately winds up finding lust, and then the great love of her life, in the most unexpected of places - with a hot, albeit mysterious, single father who was double-booked in the Hawaiian bungalow originally reserved for Iris's honeymoon. Little does Iris know, the hot stranger she barges into while he's in the shower is an elite NFL quarterback who's looking to make a change in his life - and who also thoroughly enjoys the fact that Iris has absolutely no idea who he is. Great for fans of Josie Silver's *One Night on the Island* and readers of Lucy Score and Tessa Bailey.

For fans of Casey McQuiston and Alexis Hall, a sapphic romcom about a fake relationship with real emotions: fresh off breaking up with her boyfriend and swerving away from the conventional married life she never wanted, Clementine is ready to explore the alternatives. And though a fake relationship to appease family sounds like a recipe for disaster, Clem finds herself saying yes to Chloe. Before they have attended Clem's parents' party and Chloe's friend's wedding, the two of them end up spending a lot of time together. As the attraction between them grows, it begins to feel real to Clem. Chloe, however, is fine as just friends. How can Clem persuade her otherwise?

RUSTLER MOUNTAIN by Maisey Yates – March 2025

Small-town Western spice with a bad boy/good girl trope for fans of Elsie Silver and Lyla Sage: every year, thousands of people come through Rustler for the rodeo, historic home tours, old-fashioned candy making demonstrations —and to see the site of the 1800s shootout in which notorious outlaw Austin Wilder was killed by Sheriff Lee Talbot. Now Millie Talbot, the sheriff's descendant, wants to bring back the town's Gold Rush Days. But she needs the current Austin Wilder's support to make her dream a reality. The Wilders are rumored to be as true to their last name as their ancestors. Nonetheless, Austin is agreeable to helping Millie. But he wants something in return. Austin is working to clear his family name by writing the true history of his outlaw ancestors and Millie might just hold the key. When Millie wrangles Austin into helping plan Gold Rush Days, he figures it's a chance to get to the truth of the past. But when sparks start to fly between this bad boy and good girl, will either of them come out of it unscathed?

THUS WITH A KISS I DIE: Daughter of Montague (#2) by Christina Dodd – July 2025

Continuation of *Romeo & Juliet* where the couple was able to live happily ever after and following their daughter as a clever and fiercely independent young woman in fair Verona: in book 2, fans of the bard will be happy to see some nods to *Macbeth* included. Once upon a time a young couple met and fell in love. You probably know that story, and how it ended. Only here's the thing: that's not how it ended at all. Romeo and Juliet are alive and well and the parents of seven children. At 20-years-old, Rosie is the eldest and a happy spinster – until she falls head over heels for Lysander. But their love is ill-fated as Escalus, the Prince of Verona, wishes to make Rosie *his* bride. When the ghost of Escalus's father, Prince Escalus the Elder, appears to Rosie and promises to help her if she reveals the shadows lurking beneath Verona's glittering surface, she decides to accept the risk.

THE RESURRECTIONIST by A. Rae Dunlap – January 2025

Debut in the tradition of Caleb Carr's *The Alienist* and for fans of ML Rio's *If We Were Villains* and Lydia Kang's *The Impossible Girl*. A macabre novel set during 19th century Scotland when real-life serial killers Burke and Hare terrorized the streets of Edinburgh, following a young medical student who is lured into the illicit underworld of body snatching.

Naïve but determined James has abandoned his sheltered life to pursue a dream of studying surgery in Edinburgh. A beacon of medical discovery, the university offers everything—except the chance to work on a human cadaver. For that, he needs to join one of the private schools in Surgeon's Square, at a cost he cannot afford. In desperation, he strikes a deal with Aneurin "Nye" MacKinnon, a dashing young dissectionist. Nye is a body snatcher. And James has unwittingly become his accomplice. Intoxicated by Nye and his noble mission to learn and educate, James rapidly descends into the underground ranks of the Resurrectionists—the grave robbers infamous for stealing fresh corpses from churchyards to be used as anatomical specimens. Before he knows it, James is caught up in a life-or-death scheme as rival gangs of snatchers compete in a morbid race for power and prestige. THE RESURRECTIONIST combines fact and fiction in a tale of the risks and rewards of scientific pursuit, the passions of its boldest pioneers, and the urges of human desire.

Delightfully fresh companion to the beloved *Little Women*. This imaginative historical novel shows Meg, Beth, and Amy March from behind the shadow of Jo – Louisa May Alcott's alter-ego and the "author" of *Little Women* as vibrant characters grappling with societal strictures, chronic illness, artistic ambition, and more. Ideal for readers of Geraldine Brooks' *March*, Sarah Miller's *Caroline*, and Ava Reid's *Lady Macbeth*.

Meg, pretty and conventional. Jo, stubborn, tomboyish, and ambitious. Beth, shy and good-natured. And Amy, elegant, frivolous, and shallow. But Jo, for all her insight, could not always know what was in her sisters' thoughts, or in their hearts. With Jo away in New York, pursuing her dreams of being a writer, Meg, Beth, and Amy follow their own paths. By leaving Jo off the page, the other March sisters have the room to reveal themselves through conversations, private correspondence, and intimate moments—coming alive in ways that might surprise even daring, unconventional Jo.

BEYOND THIS PLACE OF WRATH AND TEARS by Jack Ford – June 2025

Dual timeline, fact-based historical fiction telling the remarkable story of the underrecognized life of Lee Carson, a heroic female journalist who defied convention to report from the front lines of WWII. A read for fans of Kate Quinn, Christine Mangan, and Erika Robuck.

Washington, DC, April 1954: Lee, former war correspondent, is frustrated that her journalism career has been relegated to society events and fashion stories. But when she receives a tip about a Russian spy in a high-ranking government position at the height of the Cold War, she feels the thrill of a story that she hasn't felt since she was on the front lines of the European theater.

London, December 1943: As war rages across Europe, 22-year-old Lee is waging a private battle of her own. An American-born correspondent for the International News Service, she is determined to cover the war from the field. But no woman will be allowed near the front lines. Assigned to cover the build-up to the invasion of Nazi-held Europe, she constantly wrangles with authorities to get to the heart of the action. From talking herself onto a bomber and flying over Normandy at the start of D-Day to other feats of daring, she witnesses and reports on the war's most pivotal moments.

COLONY OF LOST SOULS by Kelsey James - July 2025

Historical fiction with a Gothic edge following a woman in 1930s California who goes looking for her missing sister and is drawn into a chilling cult: born a year apart, May and June were once as close as twins. Time and a loveless marriage changed the once vibrant May into June's timid counterpart. Now, two years after June disappeared, May receives a letter from her sister inviting her to visit a mysterious colony.

The Colony lives in a magnificent Spanish Revival-style mansion perched on a bluff overlooking the Pacific and is presided over by the group's charismatic leader, Rex. Colony members believe in an afterlife where departed souls mingle, and that the truly enlightened can summon back the spirits of lost loved ones. May is told that June has recently left on a mission, and she's intrigued enough to accept Rex's invitation to stay until her sister's return. Drawn deeper into the group, and under Rex's seductive spell, May undergoes their initiation ceremony. Yet her questions grow more urgent with June's continued absence—and the warnings of a presumptuous but charming undercover investigator. May has longed for the daring, adventurous life her sister pursued, but her arrival has sparked a dangerous unraveling within the Colony, where nothing and no one is quite as it seems.

THE ENTIRELY TRUE STORY OF THE FANTASICAL MESMERIST NORA GREY by Kathleen Kaufman – August 2025

Atmospheric dual timeline historical fiction set in 1900 and 1866, from Scotland to Wales to Boston, this is a heartbreaking exploration of feminine rage, power, and agency: leaving behind a quiet life, Nairna traverses the Scottish countryside with her charlatan father, Tavish. From remote cottages to rural fairs, the duo scrapes by on paltry coins as Tavish orchestrates 'encounters' with the departed, while Nairna interprets tarot cards. But beyond her father's trickery, Nairna possesses a genuine gift for communicating with the spirit world, one that could get an impoverished country girl branded a witch. A talent inherited from her grandmother, Lottie, whose story of imprisonment and exploitation in a notorious asylum is calling out to Nairna from four decades past—a warning to break free from the manipulations and betrayals of others.

Rescued from homelessness by a well-connected stranger, Nairna is whisked into a new life among Edinburgh's elite Spiritualist circle, including visiting American star Dorothy Kellings. Researchers, doctors, psychics, and thrill-seekers clamor for the rising young medium. But after a séance with blood-chilling results, a shocking scandal ensues, and Nairna flees to a secluded community near Boston, where she assumes a new identity: Nora Grey.

MURDER IN HIGHBURY by Vanessa Kelly - November 2024

Start of a Regency mystery series featuring Jane Austen's Emma Knightly from a beloved historical romance author: less than one year into her marriage to respected magistrate George Knightley, Emma has grown content in her partnership. The height of summer sees the former Miss Woodhouse gracefully balancing the management of her family estate and a flurry of social engagements. But circumstances change in an instant when Emma and Harriet Martin, now the wife of one of Mr. Knightley's tenant farmers, discover a hideous shock at the local church. The corpse of Mrs. Augusta Elton, the vicar's wife, has been discarded on the altar steps.

As a murder mystery blooms and chaos descends upon the tranquil village of Highbury, the question isn't who committed the crime, but who wasn't wishing for the unpleasant woman's demise. When suspicions fall on a harmless local, Emma—armed with wit, unwavering determination, and extensive social connections—realizes she must navigate an investigation of her own to protect the innocent and expose the ruthless culprit hiding in plain sight.

Each book in the series will showcase well-known settings and beloved characters from *Emma*. Subsequent
books will feature crossovers with characters and settings from other Austen novels, as Emma's world
occasionally expands beyond the village of Highbury. Kelly's historical romances have previously been published
in Czech, German, Italian, Romanian, and Russian

A BEACON IN THE LIGHT: The Secret Churchill Files (#2) by David Lewis - July 2025

A British spy works alongside her aristocratic partner to root out Nazi collaborators in this WWII caper: Britain has endured the bombing campaign of the Blitz. Caitrin, too, strives to weather each challenge that comes her way, though her banter belies deep heartbreak. But now the war has entered another phase. Instead of indiscriminate bombing, the Luftwaffe is pinpointing historic targets, including cathedrals and ancestral homes. And soon it is not just historical targets under attack, but hospitals and medical facilities too. Tasked with rooting out the saboteurs placing the beacons, she finds that all roads lead to Teddy, a charismatic Whitechapel crook with high aspirations and zero scruples.

A SLASH OF EMERALD: Dr. Julia Lewis Mystery (#2) by Patrice McDonough - March 2025

A trailblazing female medical examiner in 1867 London and a skeptical Scotland Yard detective investigate a string of art world murders in this dark, historically rich mystery. Among the genteel young ladies of London society, painting is a perfectly acceptable pastime—but a woman who dares to pursue art as a profession is another prospect, indeed. Dr. Julia Lewis, familiar with the disrespect afforded women in untraditional careers, is hardly surprised when Scotland Yard shows little interest in complaints made by her friend, Mary, about a break-in at her art studio.

Painters' sitters are vanishing, too—women viewed by some as dispensable outcasts. But when someone close to them commits suicide and a young woman turns up dead, the case can no longer be so easily ignored by 'respectable' society.

THE DETERMINED by Rachel Rueckert – May 2025

Set during the Golden Age of Pirates and based on the real experiences of the era's most fascinating pirates: Anne Bonny and Mary Read. Rueckert aims to upend stereotypes of female pirates and excavates these two figures in a story of passion, fierce female friendships, and women confronting the impossible.

For Anne and Mary, life at sea offers a freedom that few women ever know. Born to an Irish gentleman and his maid, Anne leaves her beloved County Cork behind when her family emigrates to escape prejudice. Cornered in a crisis, she flees, making a bitter bargain for safe passage to the Bahamas. Across the Atlantic in England, Mary confronts her own limitations as an illegitimate daughter. Sneaking into a merchant crew, she disguises herself as a cabin boy, working harder than the men to avoid scrutiny. But when war breaks out and sends Mary into the cavalry, she meets a challenge even she might not rival. When their paths collide in Nassau, a notorious pirate den, Anne and Mary find kinship and a new life aboard the infamous Revenge, the fastest ship in the Caribbean. And from the high seas to the depths of a Jamaican prison, Anne and Mary must navigate impossible choices, each determined to taste freedom again.

AN UNQUIET PEACE: Bishop & Gallagher (#2) by Shaina Steinberg – May 2025

"Mr. and Mrs. Smith" meets Elizabeth Wein's *Code Name Verity* in this mystery set in late-1940s Los Angeles, as former WWII spy Evelyn and detective Nick team up as an unconventional duo: as an undercover operative during World War II, Evelyn routinely embarked on deadly missions. By contrast, civilian life should be simple. Yet Evelyn struggles with the responsibility of being the new president of Bishop Aeronautics. With Nick, at least, Evelyn can be entirely herself. Once a fellow spy, now her fiancé, Nick works as a private investigator. But the mission that first brought them together is not entirely over. Evelyn receives a call from her former commanding officer, who is overseeing the Berlin Airlift. He is concerned that the Soviets are trying to recruit a scientist Evelyn and Nick smuggled out of Nazi Germany.

DEATH ON CORFU (#1) by Emily Sullivan - May 2025

Historical mystery series perfect for fans of the television shows "The Durrells in Corfu" or "Hotel Portofino": in Greece at the turn of the 20th century British widow Minnie isn't used to putting herself first after she moved away from England only to be left raising two children alone on a Greek Island following her husband's unexpected death. When famous mystery author Stephen Dorian settles into a neighboring villa to escape writer's block and hidden scandals, she is intrigued at first by the handsome Londoner—until he proves to be nothing more than a boorish grump. Determined to avoid the man as much as possible, Minnie is shocked when he offers her a well-paid job as his typist. But before Minnie can fully regret her decision to take the job, she makes a horrifying discovery that changes everything. A young maid has been murdered, and local authorities aren't moving fast enough to bring justice to the terrible crime. Unwilling to allow the death to fade into obscurity like the stories of so many other women deemed unworthy by society, Minnie launches an investigation of her own—and reluctantly accepts Stephen's help.

THE HEIR: A Young Queen Victoria Mystery (#1) by Darcie Wilde – September 2025

New historical mystery set in 1830s London starring young Queen Victoria as an amateur sleuth: Victoria remembers nothing but Kensington Palace. Arriving as a baby, she has been brought up inside its musty walls. Raised with an incredibly strict regimen to follow, always watched by her mother and her prized advisor, the power-hungry Sir John Conroy, the bright 15-year-old is allowed no freedom. But one fateful afternoon, Victoria slips away from her mother to ride out on her beloved horse. But what would normally be an uneventful trot around very familiar terrain presents the mutinous princess with a most bewildering sight—a dead man on the grounds of the palace. Determined to get to the bottom of the inscrutable puzzle, young Victoria is met with shocking disrespect and any number of obstacles. But Victoria will not be deterred from solving the crime.

THE LIES THEY TOLD by Ellen Marie Wiseman – September 2025

New York Times-bestselling author Wiseman returns with her latest historical fiction: told through the eyes of an unforgettable heroine, this powerful and detailed novel explores the shocking reality behind one of the darkest episodes of the early 20th century. Silas, a widowed family relative, reluctantly brings immigrant Lena and her daughter to his weathered cabin in the mountains to care for his home and children. Though the hills around Wolfe Hollow remind Lena of her German homeland, she struggles to adjust. Worse, she is stunned to learn the children in her care have been taught to hide when the sheriff comes around. As Lena meets their neighbors, she realizes the community is vibrant and tight knit, but also senses growing unease. The government is scheming to paint them as ignorant and immoral so they can evict them from their land, seize children from parents, and deal with those possessing "inferior genes."

After a social worker from the Eugenics Office accuses Lena of promiscuity and feeblemindedness, her own worst fears come true. Sent to the Colony for the Feebleminded and Epileptics, Lena face impossible choices in hopes of reuniting with her daughter—and protecting the people, and the land, she has grown to love. Wiseman's novels focus on women trying to find personal power and agency in situations where they have had that solidly taken away from them.

His heritage is one of layered secrets and divisions—between the grandmothers who love him and the aunt who wants him dead, the Catholic orthodoxy of his school and the Obeah knowledge of his grandfather, and the indigenous and the colonial. The violence he's witnessed inhabits not only strangers but himself. The spirits of the dead visit him with advice, threats, and explanations. And when he sees a path toward happiness in Canada, he must reconcile his intense, bittersweet love of his home with the possibility of leaving it.

REKT by Alex Gonzalez – April 2025

Disturbing examination of the future of AI and the darkest pits of the internet, tracing a young man's algorithmic descent into toxic masculinity and depravity lead by "Squid Game"-esque puppet masters in a not-too-distant future: once, Sammy Dominguez thought he knew how the world worked. Historical fantasy following a young man who captures a merman for a Brooklyn carnival: newly arrived in 1911 New York City after a lonely life in Puerto Rico, young Benny has always felt like a fish out of water. He struggles with asthma, faces prejudice for being a brown immigrant, and hides his attraction to other men. Yet Benny has an aptitude for mechanical engineering, dreaming big while working at an ironworks in Brooklyn. When a special commission from famous Coney Island theme park Luna Park arrives to build an unusual water tank, it is Benny's design that impresses the park owner, Sam Morgan. Benny takes on a new job being the merman's keeper. As weeks pass, he also befriends the warm-hearted and diverse band of outcasts in the sideshow. As Benny learns how to communicate with the merman, Rio, he discovers a whole new realm: a world where Benny can find acceptance. Yet tensions mount at Luna Park and Benny soon feels torn between supporting his newfound sideshow family versus his burgeoning love for Rio and his promise to free the merman. Caught between worlds, Benny must make a life-changing decision that will transform Luna Park — and himself — forever.

Dual timeline novel that is an atmospheric modern gothic story set in a sinister English manor house: teetering on the edge of the North Sea in Norfolk, Grimdark Hall is both grim and dark in name and nature. When Cló and Jude arrive from Toronto to claim Jude's inheritance, Cló is unsettled by the foreboding ancient building and the hostility of Jude's sisters, who stalk her every move. But Cló is drawn to the strange energy and the haunting sadness of a drowned village in the bay where ghostly church bells toll, sweeping her back into another woman's memories.

In 1645 Euphemia was accused of witchcraft and burned at the stake, screaming a curse on the Honeybornes as the flames consumed her. Now, flashes of Effie's life torment Cló at every turn. And waiting in the shadows is a darker, vengeful incarnation who has hunted them both through the centuries in search of a treasure. THE BOOK OF AUTUMN by Molly O'Sullivan – September 2025

Spellbinding debut about ambition, misogyny, and magic set in a rural boarding school, ideal for fans of dark academia, Leigh Bardugo, and Olivia Blake's *The Atlas Six*. Try as she might, anthropologist Marcella can't escape the fact that she is merely one half of a magical duo, forever tied together to enable the other's powers. After a tumultuous final year at university in rural New Mexico, Cella felt more than a little prickly about returning to the sun-drenched desert campus ever again. She had cut ties both magically and romantically with her other half, the rugged rancher Max, and sworn off Magic, academia, and heartache for good.

That is until a disturbing occurrence at the college leaves a star-student dead, and Cella is drawn back into a world she's done everything to leave behind. She and Max alone possess the skills necessary to investigate the alleged murderess, also a student, held captive in the infirmary, speaking in guttural tones and sending crucifixes flying off the wall. While rumors swirl around the school like dusty tumbleweeds, Cella and Max do their best to focus on their task and not get pulled back into their history with each other.

In tune with her magic again, Cella makes a discovery: the answer to the murder lies beside another truth she's tried desperately to keep buried all this time. Though it's the last thing she wants to do, Cella must revisit the past to stop actions set in motion centuries ago, by a dark force she's not sure she can rival alone.

BLOOD SLAVES by Markus Redmond – August 2025

Alternate history that is part historical drama and part supernatural horror imagining what if a mystifying revolt precluded the Civil War and changed history as we know it? The vampire origin story is reimagined in this terrifying novel of ancient lore, startling revenge, and immortal emancipation in set in the 18th century: in the Province of Carolina, 1710, freedom seems unattainable for Willie, Gertie, and their unborn child. They live, suffer, and toil under their brutal master, Big Jim, whose plantation was built by the blood, sweat, and tears of the enslaved. To flee this hell on earth is be hunted and killed. Until one strange night Willie is offered a dark hope by Rafazi, an enigmatic slave with a blood-chilling path to liberation.

Rafazi is the lone survivor of the Ramanga, an African vampire tribe. He has roamed the world for centuries with an undying desire to replenish the power that once defined his heritage. In Willie, Rafazi has found his first subject to be turned in a bid to start a revolt. And Willie desires nothing more than to free his people from malicious bondage - whatever it takes. As an army of blood slaves thirsting for revenge is gathered, the headstrong Gertie fears that no good can come from the vampiric legacy that courses through Rafazi's veins. On the other hand, Willie believes that only evil can fight evil. And when the woman he loves stands between the reemergence of the Ramanga and the justified slaughter of the oppressors, Willie must make an irreversible decision that changes history forever.

THE MEMORY HUNTERS by Mia Tsai – August 2025

First in a duology set in a world where memories are treated as commodities, following a memory hunter and her bodyguard who unearth a terrible secret about the foundations of their society. For fans of Arkady Martine, Samantha Shannon, and Katy Hays: Key can dive deeper into blood memories than anyone, but instead of devoting her talents to the temple she's meant to lead, Key is determined to use her skill as a researcher for the Museum of Human Memory.

Valerian might look like a delicate country girl, but her lightning-fast swords protect Key from murderous rivals and her own enthusiasm alike. Vale cares about Key as a friend, but more than anything, she needs to keep her job so she can support her parents and siblings. But when Key collects a memory about the temple's founding that diverges from official history, only Vale sees the fallout. Key's mentor suspiciously dismisses the finding. Her powerful mother demands she stop research altogether. And Key, unusually affected by the memory, begins to lose moments, then minutes, then days. As Vale becomes increasingly entangled in Key's obsessive drive for answers, the two women uncover a shattering discovery. Key and Vale can remain complicit, or they can jeopardize everything to bring the truth to light; either way, Key is becoming consumed by the past in more ways than one, and time is running out.

True story of Denmark's resistance movement and the everyday heroes who banded together to help the nation's Jewish citizens escape Nazi persecution and sail to sanctuary in Sweden. In 1940, on its way to conquering Western Europe, Germany coerced the Danish government into a "cooperative" agreement that lasted three long years until the increasing brazenness of the Resistance movement prompted a crackdown. Denmark's nearly 8000 Jews, who had so far been spared Hitler's wrath, now became the focus of his rage. A roundup was ordered to begin on October 1st, 1943, the first day of the Jewish New Year. Until the last moment, Sweden didn't agree to allow the refugees into the country; and the strait between the two nations was swarming with Gestapo. What happened next was a miracle. 95% of Denmark's Jews survived the Holocaust, the highest percentage in Europe. SCOUT CAMP by James Renner – March 2025

Shocking in its revelations of criminal activities, Renner's new true crime book is a page-turning masterpiece of no-holds-barred journalism mixed with memoir. In the summer of 1995, at the largest Boy Scout camp in Ohio, a night of sexual violence ended with one counselor dead and another in the hospital. The cause of death was ruled "accidental," but evidence strongly suggests suicide, or maybe even murder. Months afterward, a second violent death stunned the scouting community – and left indelible scars on the campers and staff who were there. Renner was a counselor at Seven Ranges Boy Scout Reservation that year. In this true crime memoir, Renner looks back at that turbulent summer and how a secret society within scouting contributed to this tragedy and thousands more.

As he opens up his past, Renner also shines light on the decades-long history of sexual abuse within the Boy Scouts of America. In 2022 alone, the organization was rocked by 92,000 claimants who sued them because they had been abused as children. Presenting a fresh and deeply personal perspective on incidents with disturbing repercussions, Renner reconstructs the events surrounding the case from interviews, police files, and court records, along with his own recollections.

MASTER OF DRUMS: Gene Krupa and the Music He Gave the World by Elizabeth Rosenthal – May 2025

First definitive biography of Gene Krupa, the most famous drummer on the planet, whose feverish rhythms leapt across genres to change music forever. By the early 1930s, he was New York City's most in-demand drummer, and in 1934, joined brilliant clarinetist Benny Goodman's band, helped inaugurate the Swing Era, and played the first-ever swing concert at Carnegie Hall. It made history. So did Gene, whose celebrity spread with every ride cymbal beat and bass drum bomb drop. Rosenthal crafts a celebratory, honest, and exhaustively researched portrait of a twentieth-century music legend whose acolytes would include such rock-era artists as Ringo Starr, Keith Moon, John Bonham, and Apollo 440.

SEX AFTER SEXUAL ASSAULT by Katie Simon – July 2025

Recently society has begun to confront the realities of the rampant sexual assault and harassment that permeates the world. Simon has written this to take us to the next step: healing in the aftermath. SEX AFTER SEXUAL ASSAULT helps survivors of sexual assault regain a positive relationship with sex through the lens of other survivors' healing journeys.

So often, survivors of sexual trauma are treated as irreparably broken. Harmful self-help ideologies reinforce this perception or impose a single path towards healing. A guide to sexual pleasure and empowerment, this book takes a different approach by deconstructing oppressive societal narratives and providing readers with the understanding and tools to create healthy, joyous sex lives on their own terms.

Sharing true stories from survivors of diverse backgrounds, this book presents the obstacles and setbacks a survivor frequently encounters while pursuing a sex life after assault.
