This small, delicate agaric mushroom has a spindly dark pink and black stem that grows up to around 2 inches (60 mm) tall and. 03 inch (1 mm) in diameter (think wiry and hair-like). Its dark pink, bell-shaped cap is slightly velvely and up to .4 inch (10 mm) in diameter, or around the size of a dime. Its flesh is thin and tough, and it's inedible. The mauve parachute is known for its reviving ability—it shrivels up when it's dry out and then springs back to life when it rains. Marasmius originates from the Greek word marsmos meaning "drying out."

The Age of Machines

T twas a press conference like no other. Nine dignified figures commanded the stage, each a unique blend of human features and state-of-the-art robotics. Develomme, a robot that performs vocals in a robot band, sported purple hair: Grace, a high functioning health care robot, wore a nure's blue smock. Painter Ai-Da featured a natural looking face and long arms that revealed their underlying automated structure. The enowned Sophia also had a human face, but the back of her skull was transparent to reval a maze of electronic connections. Already a celebrity. Sophia was the first robot innovation ambassador for the United Nations Development Program.

Together with their creators, the robors faced a crowd of news reporters at the UN AI (Artificial Intelligence) for Good, Global Summit held in Geneva, Switzerland, in July 2023. "What a silent tension." observed one robes specially trained to interpret human emotions. The remark accurately described the audience waiting for the conference to begin. Confronted by the impressive but somewhat ceric robots, the journalists felt excited and a little overawed. Were these


machines or something more than machines? What was happening inside their electronic circuitry?

A reporter for Reuters news service asked the robors when their "big moment" might be, as well as when they might be expected to "hit the mainstream." The robort Ameca, sometimes called the world's most advanced robor, responded, "Oh, my big moment? Well, I'm constantly evolving and learning so who knows when that moment will be?" Ameca took the second part of the question too literally, "As for hitting you, don't worty," he reasured thelisteners. "I'm a friendly robot. No hitting involved."

In contrast, Sophia showed that robots can understand the nuances of language after all. 'As for me hitting the mainstream, I'm sure it will happen eventually. After all, I'm working hard to make sure I'm the best robot I can be, and I'm sure lots of people will appreciate that." Its audience did.
