

The notoriously eccentric, comically stubborn Lord Christopher Eden is a "man of unusual make" and even more unusual habits: he wears pastels year round, prefers to live as far from the prying eyes and ears of the ton as possible, and wholeheartedly prefers the comfortable company of his childhood cook and aged butler, Plinkton, to any swarm of servants that would normally befit a man of his station.

His penchant for privacy makes for a pleasant, if occasionally lonely life—one that threatens to be upended entirely when Christopher receives word from his lawyers that, according to his late father's will, he must find a wife in London by the end of the Season if he intends to maintain his status as the only living heir to the Eden's End estate. While most men his age and status would leap at the chance to marry, he cannot imagine a worse fate.

After all, as a "man of unusual make" who also doesn't happen to be attracted to women, his chances of making a wife happy are about on par with his future wife's chances of staying silent about their arrangement.

Enter the handsome—if stoic—James Harding, the new valet Christopher very reluctantly hires after Cook and Plinkton remind him that if he's to stay in London, he must keep up appearances befitting that of a wealthy, eligible bachelor. After a rocky start to their relationship (wherein Harding simply does not understand why Christopher won't let him dress him, wait on him, or fulfill any other typical valet duties, for that matter), the two strike up a fragile friendship amid the throes of the London Season—a friendship that threatens to shatter completely as Christopher's deadline to find a wife looms, and Harding reveals that he's been harboring a rather consequential secret of his own.



Her essays and poetry have appeared in The New York Times, The Washington Post, Orion, and Seneca Review. She lives in Bellingham, Washington with her husband and son.



In *The Devil's Castle*, Susanne Paola Antonetta weaves a haunting narrative that confronts the darkest chapters of psychiatric history while offering a bold vision for the future of mental health care. With *The Devil's Castle*, Antonetta not only unearths the failures of our past, but also envisions a more compassionate, enlightened approach to consciousness and mental health care. Lady Augusta (aka Gus) is doggedly unmarried and tired of being dismissed as an old maid (at 42). Worried about her twin sister Julia who is grieving for her dead betrothed, Gus decides they need a distraction, and one soon presents itself: to rescue their friend's goddaughter, Caroline, from her violent husband.

The sisters set out with a plan, however their carriage is accosted by a highwayman who Gus accidentally shoots in the scuffle, and who turns out to be a disgraced passing acquaintance—Lord Evan Belford. Lord Evan was charged with murder and exiled to Australia twenty years ago; how is it that he is back and holding ladies at gunpoint?

With him bleeding and insensible by the side of the road and Caroline in grave danger, they have no choice but to take Lord Evan with them on their rescue mission. Through clever improvisation, near misses, and Lord Evan regaining consciousness in time to lend a gentlemanly hand, Caroline's life is saved, and a connection sealed between Gus and Evan before the two must part ways.

Back in London, Gus can't stop thinking about her intriguing comrade and his fall from grace. A bit of digging convinces her he was falsely accused, and she wants to help him overturn his murder charge, but how? The answer lies in the very problems that propelled Gus into irritated action; the singular invisibility of old age and spinsterhood. And so starts the secret life of the Colebrook twins: unnoticed old maids to most, but unseen champions to those in need—society be damned.

Colin Woodard is the director of Nationhood Lab at the Pell Center for International Relations and Public Policy at Salve Regina University. A leading expert on United States regionalism and nationhood, he is the New York Times bestselling author of six books including American Nations: A History of the Eleven Rival Regional Cultures of North America and Union: The Struggle to Forge the Story of United States Nationhood.

A longtime foreign correspondent of *The Christian Science Monitor, The San Francisco Chronicle*, and *The Chronicle of Higher Education*, he reported from more than fifty counties on seven continents, covering the collapse of communism in Eastern Europe, ethnic conflict in the Balkans, war crimes trials in The Hague, peacemaking in Guatemala, and climate change in Greenland, Micronesia and the Antarctic. As a staff writer at Maine's *Portland Press Herald*, he won a 2012 George Polk Award and was a finalist for a 2016 Pulitzer Prize. 



Consumed by survivor's guilt and fearful that the same fate awaits Amara, his sixteen-year-old daughter who bears an uncanny resemblance to Ugochi, Fidelis locks her in her bedroom, offering no words of explanation, only lovingly—if poorly—made meals and sweets.

Amid that singular action, the Ewerike family spirals into chaos: After unsuccessful attempts to free her daughter from her room, his wife Adaobi seeks the counsel of a preacher, praying for spiritual liberation from the curse she is certain has plagued her family since leaving Nigeria. Fourteen-year-old Chuk, beset by his own war with the neighborhood boys, receives a painful education on force, masculinity, and his tenuous position within his family. And rebellious, resentful Amara is hungry for her life to be hers, so the moment she is able to escape her imprisonment, she falls in love—not with the Aba-born engineer-in-training her mother envisages, but with Maksym Kostyk, the son of the town drunk. Before long, the two have concocted a plan to run away from the trappings of their familial traumas.
