Someone who felt the exact same way about me, I was sure.

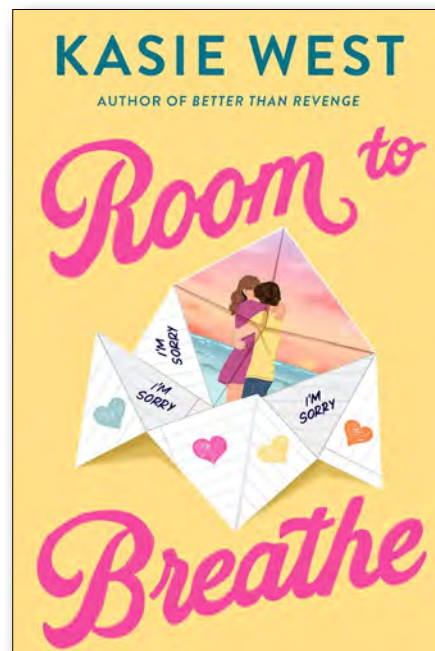
